
RITUAL: A Collection of Muslim Australian Poetry

As Australia's first anthology to showcase the work of Muslim-identifying poets, the collection offers an urgent and necessary contribution to the global tradition of Islamic-inspired poetry.

The transformative collection was edited by award-winning Palestinian-Australian author and poet, **Sara M Saleh**, and award-winning Pakistani-Australian poet, **Zainab Syed**.

In a joint statement, Sara and Zainab said the book is essential reading during this heightened period of Islamophobic and anti-Muslim hysteria: "We are so proud to have published the first-ever anthology of Muslim poetry in Australia as a testament to the enduring power of art, especially in these times of great grief and loss."

The dynamic collection also contains a series of commissioned works by acclaimed Eritrean-Australian

storyteller, Manal Younus, and a foreword by First Nations Muslim writer and researcher, Dr Eugenia Flynn.

RITUAL features 39 Muslim Australian poets from over 25 culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds. Notable contributors include:

Omar Musa: Omar is a Bornean-Australian writer and visual artist from Queanbeyan, Canberra. His debut novel, *Here Come the Dogs* (Penguin, 2014) was longlisted for the 2015 Miles Franklin Award and won the 2015 *SMH* Best Young Novelists Award. Omar is also the author of several poetry collections, including *Parang* (Penguin, 2014), *Millefiori* (Penguin, 2017) and *Killernova* (Penguin, 2021).

Lamisse Hamouda: Lamisse is an Egyptian-Australian writer from Meanjin (Brisbane). Her debut memoir, *The Shape of Dust* (Pantera, 2023) won the 2024 National Biography Award. She is a creative writing workshop facilitator, youth worker and Adjunct Lecturer at UNSW.

Rashida Murphy: Rashida lives on the unceded lands of the Whadjuk Noongar people in Boorloo/Perth. She is the author of *The Historian's Daughter* (UWAP, 2016) and *The Bonesetter's Fee & Other Stories* (Spineless Wonders, 2021). Her poetry and prose have been featured in both national and international publications.
