

Unique partnership creates *After Australia*, a bold anthology of speculative fiction by diverse writers imagining an alternative Australia

Independent publisher Affirm Press has partnered with <u>Diversity Arts Australia</u> and the Western Sydney literacy movement <u>Sweatshop</u> to publish **After Australia**, an anthology of speculative fiction created by writers from Indigenous and culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds imagining an Australia after colonisation, after white supremacy and after climate change.

Edited by Sweatshop founder and author of *The Lebs*, Dr Michael Mohammed Ahmad, **After Australia** will be published on 9 June 2020 and features writing from emerging talents alongside established voices such as Claire G. Coleman, Omar Sakr and Michelle Law. The project is supported by a major partnership between Diversity Arts Australia and Sweatshop and by funding from an <u>Australia Council for the Arts</u> grant awarded to Diversity Arts in 2018.

This unflinching collection provides a glimpse of an alternative Australia from the perspectives of twelve of the country's most daring writers. Climate catastrophe, police brutality, white genocide, totalitarian rule and the erasure of black history provide a backdrop for stories of love, courage and hope.

After Australia features writing from Ambelin Kwaymullina, Claire G. Coleman, Omar Sakr, Future D. Fidel, Karen Wyld, Khalid Warsame, Kaya Lattimore, Sarah Ross, Zoya Patel, Michelle Law and Hannah Donnelly, a Wiradjuri woman who provides a context for the entire collection with a prologue, interlude and epilogue.
